CORPORAL HENRY CASEY

Medal of Honor Recipient

Henry Casey, the son of George and Catherine Casey, was born December 28, 1837 in New Geneva, Fayette County, Pennsylvania. He had five brothers and five sisters: James S., Susan (Rumble), Rebecca (Poundstone), Affiant Henry, Davis, Calvin, Asable Elizabeth (Nelson), David, Mary (Sears Black), and Dorcas (Shelton).

He moved to Marion Township, Fayette County, Ohio in November, 1860. He married Catherine W. Holland of Paint Township, Fayette County, Ohio. She was the daughter of Charles and Elizabeth Holland. They had nine children: Eva Malinda, Frank S., Carrie E. M., Ollie C. E., Calvin H., Cora I., Mystle F. and a son and daughter who died as infants.

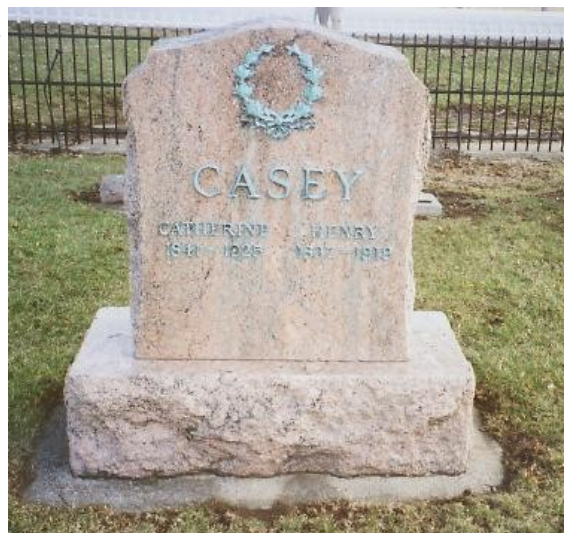
His enlistment form indicates he was 5 feet 8 inches tall with light complexion, hazel eyes and dark hair. He enlisted in Company C, 20th Ohio Volunteer Infantry September 8, 1861 at Bloomingburg, Ohio when he was 23 years old. He was appointed Corporal on January 27, 1865. He was discharged July 15, 1865 at Louisville, Kentucky. The Medal of Honor was awarded to him on the 17th day of September 1897 for "Most distinguished gallantry at Vicksburg Miss. April 22, 1863, in volunteering and serving as one of the crew of a transport that was under very heavy fire in passing the forts at that place." Gen. Grant gave him a 30 day furlough for his valor.

He was a Republican and served from 1873, until his death on May 9, 1919, as Treasurer of Bloomingburg Lodge No. 449 Free and Accepted Masons of Ohio. He died at his home near Bloomingburg at the age of 81, and is buried beside his wife at the Bloomingburg Cemetery.

Location of his Medal of Honor

Henry Casey's Medal of Honor is at the Veterans Memorial Museum in Chehalis, Washington, along with his unit pin and a photo of the men who also received medals with him. These items are on loan from Everett M. Durst III.

The Dayton Public Library has a book entitled "History of the 20th O.V.I. Regiment, and Proceedings of the First Reunion At Mt. Vernon, Ohio April 6 1876."

Henry Casey Camp No. 92 Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War was organized August 12, 1992 by Robert E. Grim. At that time he was a member of Gov. William Dennison Camp No. 125 which held its meetings in Jackson, Ohio. Robert E. Grim first joined the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War as a member-at-large of the Ohio Department Headquarters Camp No. 1 on March 26, 1988. In 1990 he transferred his membership to Gov. Dennison Camp No. 125. Because of the great distance involved in traveling to Jackson to attend camp meetings he decided to form a camp closer to his home.

An organizational meeting was held at the Golden Coral Restaurant on Columbus Avenue in Washington Court House on August 12, 1992 at 6:30 p.m. The following people who would become members of the camp attended that meeting: Irven R. Cassio, Shawn A. Cox, Ronnie D. Cox, James L. Grim, Raymond M. Grim, Jr., Robert E. Grim, Rodney R. Grim, William E. Radabaugh, and Marvin R. Seymore.

Also in attendance at the organizational meeting were the following guest: Ohio Department Commander David R. Medert, Ohio Department Junior Vice Commander Chip Rogers, Ohio Department Camp Organizer Keith Ashley and the Senior Vice Commander of Gov. William Dennison Camp No. 125 John Barnes. Several ladies also attended as guest: Irene G. Looker, Senior Vice-President of the Ohio Department Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic, Ellie Grim (wife of James L. Grim), Charlotte A. Grim (wife of Robert E. Grim), Ruth Cox (wife of Ronnie D. Cox), Rose Cox (Mother of Shawn A. Cox) and June Green.

At this meeting the group selected, at the suggestion of George D. H. Grim, the camp name Henry Casey to honor Civil War Corporal Henry Casey from Bloomingburg, Ohio who was a recipient of the Medal of Honor. The number 92 was selected for the camp since the camp was being organized in the year 1992. It was thought that members would always be able to remember the year the camp was organized.

The group also approved a camp constitution and by-laws. Camp meetings were set for the 4th Wednesday

Christopher S. Grim, David W. Grim, George D. H. Grim, Harold M. Grim, James L. Grim, Max E. Grim, Paul S. Grim, Raymond M. Grim, Jr., Robert E. Grim, Rodney R. Grim, Willard A. Grim, Robert E. Morris, William E. Radabaugh, Marvin R. Seymore and Jeremy J. Wickersham.

The Charter presentation was planned for 2:00 p.m. September 19 with October 10th as an alternate date.

The Fayette County Commission on Aging Senior Citizens Center, 1179 S. Elm St., Washington Court House, Ohio was selected as the site for the ceremony. This site was selected because of its connection to the Civil War.

Located in that Center are thirty-three plaques made of Italian marble, each weighing 400 pounds, six feet tall, more than three feet wide, and nearly two inches thick, bearing the names

of approximately 2800 Fayette County soldiers who served in the Civil War.

The plaques were originally mounted on the walls of the G. A. R. auditorium Hall on Court Street in Washington Court House.

The plaques were placed at the Senior Citizens Center in September, 1981. These white marble plaques had been ordered in Italy, where they were processed, lettered and shipped all ready to be placed in position when they arrived. The entire shipment reached here without any breakage. One of the plaques bears the names of the county commissioners who were in office at that time as well as the Memorial Hall Trustees.

A second tablet is devoted exclusively to Baldwin Hartzelle Millikan, member of Company C, 14th Ohio Volunteer Infantry, who was born July 12, 1842 and died March 20, 1914. He had been active in G. A. R. circles and was prominent in the business, civic and social life of the city throughout his life. He was a member of one of the county's foremost pioneer families.

The Charter presentation ceremony took place as scheduled on October 10, 1992 at 2:00 p.m. at the Senior Citizens Center. Ohio Department Commander David R. Medert presented the Charter to Henry Casey Camp Commander Robert E. Grim. He then initiated the members of Henry Casey Camp and installed the camp officers. Several members of Governor William Dennison Camp No. 125 from Jackson, Ohio participated in the ceremonies including Dennison Camp Commander and Ohio Department Junior Vice Commander Charles "Chip" Rogers. They were dressed in Civil War uniforms and several of their wives attended dressed in Civil War period costumes. Commander Grim gave a brief history of the G.A.R. and told about the plaques located in the Senior Citizens Center and issued membership cards to the Camp Casey members.

The Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic Circle No. 25 located in Washington Court House served refreshments and sold plates once used by the GAR Hall in Washington C. H. Irene Grim Looker past president of Circle No. 25 and Senior Vice President of the Ohio Department Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic brought official greetings to the new camp.

The year 1993 was an exciting year for Henry Casey Camp No. 92. The camp retained the officers selected at the October 10, 1992 installation ceremony. The camp obtained an Employer Identification Number from the Internal Revenue Service : EIN 31-1356384, and the camp purchased a frame for the Camp Charter; a Camp Flag and a United States Flag.

Jonathan Radabaugh, son of William E. Radabaugh joined the Camp.

Several members of the Camp organized Company C, 20th Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Sons of Veterans Reserve (S.V.R.). Camp Commander Robert E. Grim was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant (SVR) and elected Commander of the unit. Robert E. Morris was elected Adjutant and First Sergeant. Marvin R. Seymore was elected Quartermaster Sergeant and Rodney R. Grim was elected Sergeant.

The Camp officers were installed on January 26th by National Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief David R. Medert. Commander Grim announced that he had been promoted to 1st Lieutenant in the SVR. The Camp purchased a new flag poles and carrying cases for the camp and United States flag.

The following SVR members attended the SVR artillery school at Chillicothe, Ohio on March 26th: Commander Robert E. Grim, Raymond Grim, Jr., William Radabaugh, Marvin Seymore, Greg Cox, Shawn Cox, and David Grim.

On May 1st the SVR members set up a camp site on the grounds of the Fayette County Historical Society Museum in Washington Court House and conducted an all day living history program in observance of the opening of the museum for the 1994 season. Artillery units from Chillicothe and Columbus provided four cannons and crews.

On Memorial Day the camp participated in five programs: At 10:30 a.m. Commander Grim dressed in uniform presented a wreath during the American Legion sponsored program at the Washington Court House Cemetery. At 1:15 p.m. SVR members marched in a parade at Lees Creek in Clinton County and served as the firing squad at the cemetery. At 3:30 p.m. they served as the firing squad for the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic Circle No. 25 program in the Washington Court House Cemetery. At 4:00 p.m. they fired a salute at the grave site of Corporal Henry Casey in the Bloomingburg Cemetery and at 4:30 p.m. they fired a salute at the grave site of William F. Grim in the Madison Mills Cemetery.

The Camp nominated Irene Grim Looker, Circle 25 Ladies of the GAR, for the Central Ohio Senior Citizens Hall of Fame.

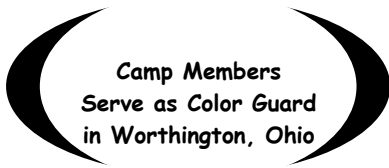

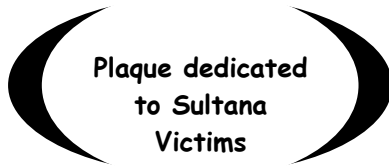
